I. Program and Outreach

Leadership 2024-25


Plans are moving forward quickly for this year's Leadership Training Series. Weekend 1 will be in Montpelier on Nov. 2-3 with GMSA acting as the lead trainer. Weekend 2 will be Dec. 7-8 in Middlebury with Amy Schollenberger from Action Circles acting as the lead trainer.

You may remember that this group was disappointed to hear the series has been cut back from 3 weekend to 2 weekends. For this reason, Kirsten is working with the Leadership Planning Team to provide more training during the legislative session. Trainees will be strongly encouraged to "Make a Date" with Sue to visit the Statehouse. The Council will work with GMSA to create a closing even in the spring with more training and a graduation ceremony.

II. Financial Issues

Year 4 begins!

October 1 is the beginning of a new federal fiscal year. This is the 4th year of our Five-Year State Plan.





At this time of year, we pay attention to how Congress is moving forward with the federal budget. Unfortunately, it is unlikely that Congress will pass a budget for the year that begins Oct. 1. They will adopt a "continuing resolution" through at least December 1, possibly later. This means the Council needs to assume it is "flat

funded," meaning we will have the same appropriation as last year – about \$520,000. We already built our budget based on this assumption.

Money from the Pathway to Partnership Grant Secured

We finally have a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with DAIL that promises us \$350,000 over five years to work on 3 of our Objectives:

- Promoting alternatives to guardianship.
- Building an online resource for parents of adults with I/DD.
- Promoting customized employment through training

This money comes for a large grant that Kirsten helped the Division for the Blind and Visually Impaired to apply for. With the MOU in place, we can now begin projects under these 3 objectives.

III. Operations

Work Plans Filed on Time

With the input of the Program Committee, Kirsten was able to file revisions to our Year 3 Work Plan. Having good revisions makes it easier for Kirsten to file out Federal Report in January. She also filed a Year 4 Workplan, though this will have to be updated in a year.



Peer Support Specialist

Kirsten and Anastasia have hired David Frye to provide peer support to our self-advocate members. He will also help keep the Vermont DD Council active on the national self-advocacy committee at the National Association of Councils on Developmental Disabilities (NACDD). David will be a contractor for the Council. His contract begins Oct. 1.
