There is no other taxi service, and Section 8 limits my choices on where I can live.

Being in a rural community can be isolating for people like me. I have no one to share my day with. I talk to my lovebird, Bacall. She may not "speak people," but she's an excellent listener.

Transportation should not be a luxury for only the rich or well-located, but a public service that every Vermonter, in every town, can access.
